5 Singleton to Broke Fordwich

74 km • 1 hr driving time

Singleton – Bulga - Milbrodale – Broke Fordwich – Singleton

km Singleton Large country town. With the VIC on your left, turn left into Campbell Street, then turn LEFT at the roundabout into John Street. Turn RIGHT at the first set of traffic lights into Ryan Avenue and just a short drive onward will bring you to the

1 Largest sundial in the Southern Hemisphere Stop and explore this magnificent structure. Continue south along Ryan Avenue to the traffic lights. RIGHT turn onto

27 Putty Road has the sharp contrast of picturesque farming countryside and open cut coal mines side by side.

57 Bulga Tiny rural village – pub, café, picnic area, toilet facilities and orange orchard where you can pick your own oranges straight from the trees.

61 Milbrodale Rural locality where you can visit Hunter Valley Macadamia Farm and

61 Biame Cave (Aboriginal Cave Paintings). Note: Gratuity Fee applies. Turn off the Putty Road just after 100km speed sign and the cave is 1.5 kilometres along the gravel road. Retrace your steps back to the Putty Road and turn right, travel 0.8 km, and then turn RIGHT into

61 Milbrodale Road a scenic drive passing Catherine Vale Wines Cellar Door (p16) on the way to

61 Broke Small rural village. The Broke-Fordwich region has numerous boutique wineries, an alpaca farm. Enjoy lunch at the local restaurants, and marvel at the

magnificent views of Yengo National Park. From Broke, follow Broke Road, turning RIGHT at the intersection with the

99 Putty Road then turn RIGHT at the intersection with the

100 Golden Highway Travel a further 4kms and turn LEFT into

105 Range Road The entrance for the Infantry Museum is through the Singleton Army Camp located on your left.

112 Royal Australian Infantry Corps Museum housing a display of the Corps history. Certainly worth a visit.

Continue along Range Road, notice on the right the magnificent historic homesteads, through rail crossing and turn LEFT onto the

116 New England Highway to return to
